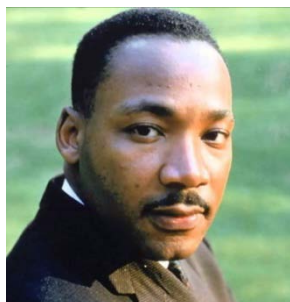

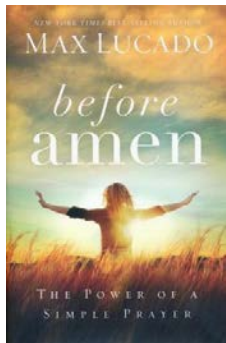

Books Offer Valuable Companions as **We Walk by Faith**. All of life's journeys share some things in common, and our personal faith journeys are no different. We seek a clear destination, a path to follow and a companion along the path -- someone who can share their experience, illuminate the way and encourage us to persist. Books can supply the kinds of companions we need, and our current bulletin board suggests a variety. Here's a look at a few.

*Walking the Bible*, by Bruce Feiler, is a geographical and spiritual journey through the Middle East. Another Feiler book, *Abraham*, is subtitled "a journey into three faiths," exploring what people of the Book share.

*How's Your Faith: An Unlikely Spiritual Journey*, by journalist David Gregory, is a memoir of his journey from non-faith to faith, exploring stages of belief.

*Sacred Journeys: An Illustrated Guide to Pilgrimages Around the World* by Jennifer Westwood explores the literal and spiritual journeys others have taken to affirm and grow faith.

*40 Day Journey with Dietrich Bonhoeffer* and *40 Day Journey with Martin Luther*. Each book offers a walk with men who share meditations on faith. (Consider Henri Nouwen, too.)

*Places on the Way: Meditations on the Journey of Faith* by Martin E. Marty is described by Goodreads as "a pilgrimage of the heart through image and word" -- photographs and meditations for prayer and reflection.

On Reformation Sunday, during worship, we had the opportunity to add our signatures to the new Reformation Welcome Statement – a statement that lifts up our mission to invite and welcome ALL people here. One way that we have been living that out in these past few months is through the work of our new Accessibility Task Force.

This group has been working to ensure that all parts of Reformation’s building and programs are accessible to all people.

Some small changes have already been put in place. The drop down bars on the upstairs coat racks enable children and people in wheelchairs to access the coat rack. New signs with braille have been placed throughout the building and braille added to existing signs. New braille toys are now available in the Pray Ground at the back of the sanctuary and a braille hymnal is also available!

Much more is planned as we continue to strive to make sure that all are welcome and can participate fully in the life of Reformation!

# 2019 Scholar-in-Residence Registration

**The Rev. Dr. Kristin Johnston Largen**

***21<sup>st</sup> Century Insights for God-Talk, Scripture Interpretation, and Following Jesus***

The Rev. Dr. Kristin Johnston Largen is a professor of systematic theology at United Lutheran Seminary.

In her presentation Dr. Largen will look at how various contemporary theologians opened up new ways of thinking about sin and human nature, reading the Bible, images and language for God, and understanding Jesus.

**The Rev. Dr. Kristin Johnston Largen** was born in Colorado and still considers Colorado the home of her heart. She began serving at United Lutheran Seminary (Gettysburg) in 2006 and teaches in the area of systematic theology, focusing particularly on comparative theology with Buddhism and Hinduism. She also works in 21st century theology, specifically with feminist and liberation theologies. She is the editor of *Dialog: A Journal of Theology*, and her most recent books are *Finding God among our Neighbors*, vol. 1 & 2 (Fortress Press, 2013 & 2017).

She also serves half-time as Associate Dean of Religious and Spiritual Life/College Chaplain at Gettysburg College. She is a runner, hiker, avid reader, longtime vegetarian and animal lover, and amateur harp player. She lives with her husband John in Gettysburg and have a very sweet Jack Russell Terrier, Henry.
