A Public Statement by the Interfaith Council of Southern Delaware County

Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. in his letter to religious leaders once said, "Moreover, I am cognizant of the interrelatedness of all communities and states. I cannot sit idly by in Atlanta and not be concerned about what happens in Birmingham. Injustice anywhere is a threat to justice everywhere. We are caught in an inescapable network of mutuality, tied in a single garment of destiny. Whatever affects one directly affects all indirectly."

We, as members of the Interfaith Council of Southern Delaware County, Pennsylvania, affirm the interrelatedness of our communities and states. When an injustice occurs in our society, we find it imperative to not sit idly by. We grieve when we see miscarriages of justice, and we name our grief with the families of George Floyd, Ahmaud Arbery, Breona Taylor, and many others who have been victims of systemic racism and who cry out for equity. For what affects one affects us all. This is why we cannot remain silent. For silence in the face of hate is itself iniquity. We cannot be complacent or complicit.

We feel we must speak up and speak out, and are united in decrying oppression, the upholding of white supremacy, and discrimination in all forms. We can and must band together to fight the ravages of overt and covert racism.

As a consortium of faith communities, we will continue to pray and work to call out acts of hate that hurt and divide our community. We are one.

In fact, someone has said that this is a "feel true" film. It is a film full of heart but contains challenges to both patriarchy and colonialism. The director Mira Nair, an Indian-American, wanted to make a film so that Anglo-Americans could see life through the eyes of "the other." Stay and Play Update

Dear Members of Reformation Lutheran Church,

In accordance with Governor Wolf's orders, we closed our doors on March 13. We had hoped to re-open before the end of the school year but that was not the case. Since our program does not run a summer camp, we will not re-open until the start of the 2020/2021 school year.

During the closure, we have maintained regular communication with our students and their parents through phone calls, e-mails, mailings and the oh-so-popular Zoom meetings. We have two drive by pickup days scheduled before the end of the school year so that families can pick up their child's items from their cubbies as well as art work that would have been showcased in our end of the year art show. As directors of the program, Diane and Marion are in the office 2-3 days a week. We have been sanitizing toys, inventorying supplies, tending to maintenance issues, staying on top of licensing paperwork and packing up the school for the remainder of the closure. Our staff have been busy finishing up their child observations and required trainings.

Since our families pay monthly, we issued credits to the families for the first 2 weeks of the closure since they paid for those days in advance. This resulted in a loss of just under \$7,000. Our parent representative decided to reach out to the families and see if they would donate their credit back to the program to help us offset the loss in our budget. We graciously received over \$4,500 of those funds back. We held an emergency board meeting in March, and it was voted that all our teachers would be paid until the end of the school year.

Additionally, during the closure, we were able to donate boxes of unopened food to the Media Food Bank. Thank you, Deacon Beth, for your help with this. We also had a parent who organized a collection to donate lunches to first responders. We are thankful to Pastor Wayne who has provided guidance and insight during this crisis and Paul Sterns who has responded to all our maintenance issues.
