Ash Wednesday

We will mark the beginning of our Lent journey on Ash Wednesday with worship at both 12 noon and 7:30 pm. Both services will include the imposition of ashes and communion. The 7:30 pm service will be live streamed. We look forward to you joining us for worship on **February 22**.

Ashes Under the Tent

Ashes will be distributed on **February 22**, 5:00-6:00 pm in the East Parking Lot, weather permitting. Stop by any time during this hour for a brief, 3-4 minute gathering for prayer and the imposition of ashes under the pop-up canopy.

Midweek Lent Soup Supper and Evening Worship

Each Wednesday in Lent following Ash Wednesday, we invite you to gather for a soup supper and fellowship at 6:30 pm in Creighton Hall. The soup supper will be followed by Holden Evening Prayer in the sanctuary at 7:30 pm. The first gathering will be held on **March 1**. You are welcome to join us for both – or come and join us at the start of worship. If you are able to bring soup or bread to the meal, please sign up in the lobby.

Stations in the Street Prayer Path

The wood chipped path around the Reformation property will once again host *Stations in the Street* – an art exhibit of the stations of the cross by Scott Erikson. You are welcome to visit the path anytime during Lent – **February 22** to **April 9**. Booklets with information about the art and reflections from the artist are at the entrance of the path (in the corner of the East Parking Lot farthest from the gazebo).

February ECO Tip



Be good to your vehicle, and it will be good to you! Inflate your tires once a month or as necessary. Replace the air filter and tune up your engine regularly.

CG 1 - Connecting Threads

Saturdays, 11 am - 12 noon in the ROCK Room led by Laura Reiter and Marian Filtz

We have all benefited from the warmth that quilts provide! In this connection group, we invite you to share in quilt lore and in the age-old techniques of quilting. Our classes will have three parts. In the first part of our gathering, we will have "Show-n-Tell". We will bring quilt samples and we invite you to bring quilts you treasure. We will share the story of the quilt and the talented makers behind the needle. In the second part of your gathering, we will share some history of quilting, methods, strategies and the culture of quilting. Lastly, we will provide hands-on demonstrations and invite "audience" participation. We will provide all the supplies, fabric, batting, and needles.

Quilting connects us to the treasured past, crafty present and to each other as makers. We will be able to do some techniques anyone can do at home without a sewing machine. We know some of you already sew and others are curious beginners. We welcome everyone and are prepared and excited to adapt the class to meet your interest!

CG 2 – Lenten Meditation and Labyrinths

Saturdays, 10 - 11 am in Creighton Hall led by Joyce McNally

We will look at the 7 gifts of the Holy Spirit using different types of meditation techniques including the use of labyrinths. Each week will be focused on a different gift. Scripture readings on the gifts will be introduced with Lectio Divina, then we'll do a meditation highlighting the week's gift theme. Use of finger labyrinths and walking labyrinths will be utilized as examples of meditation.

CG 3 - Hope, Health and Happiness

This is the question we are asking the congregation to ponder this Lent as a devotional practice, leaning into our 2022-2023 theme of *Living Hope*.

I believe hope comes from where we see glimpses of God peeking through into our world; moments that make us feel like there is good yet to come. Hope is a living, growing being--which you'll see through our art installation in the sanctuary this season! Hope is what early Christians were so deeply in need of, the reason that the ministry of Jesus and the reality of the cross were so powerful: they inspired hope where there was none.
