The west entrance to the Church building is not used as much as other entrances and, some of you may have never used it. But, it is an important entrance for people attending meetings especially in the evening. The chancel choir members all use the west entrance for rehearsals held in the evening.

A couple years ago Paul and Donna Jann noted that it would be helpful if some handrails were installed by the two large steps that lead to the stairway. Some concern was also expressed about the lighting. Solar lights were being used along the walkway and, unfortunately, not enough light was being supplied.

Fast forward to this year when Leo Foti and Dick Hughey (confirmation student and mentor) were looking for a good Church project to complete. They reviewed the situation and got a game plan together. Realizing some skilled work was required, they made Vince Walsh aware of the project. Vince is well known to Reformation having designed and installed the labyrinth, worked on the gazebo and provided expert landscape design and installation around the Church property. He knew what we needed.

The result: we have new handrails, hardwired lighting and a much improved and welcoming west entrance.

1:00 pm. The service will be held around the back of the church building. If your pet is unable to attend the service, please feel free to bring a photo of them. You are also invited to bring



### **Finance Smart**

How safe are you keeping your personal information? I'm sure

this question has popped into your mind many times. With all the cyber threats and attacks happening lately, who wouldn't think about it? So let's go over some things that will help you to safeguard your personal information.

Passwords should be extremely difficult to guess. If you're using easy passwords, change them immediately. Be creative! And if you're using the same password for every website, that's a "no no"! Personal information, especially social security numbers, should not be sent in emails or texts. Do not give your information to someone you don't recognize or enter it into a website that is not secure or authentic. If you've never used a particular website before, check the website's credentials first. Be careful what you share on social media. If your kids are on social media, it's wise to check their privacy settings and discuss with them what's safe to share and what's not. Be careful when using free Wi-Fi when you are out and about, such as doctors' offices, grocery stores, or while having your vehicle serviced. Never access your bank account or enter credit card numbers while on free Wi-Fi. Always wait until you're on a more secured network.


