3. Check your email for the code.
4. Enter the code into the app.
5. Enjoy access to the online directory.

### From your computer:

3. Find "First Time Signing In?" and click "Create a Login Now".
4. Enter your email address and create a password.

## Finance Smart

We are all aware that financial scams continue to rise and thieves are becoming craftier by the day; therefore, I thought it would be beneficial to share with you a personal experience of being scammed. A few months ago, a teller at my husband's bank gave him a fake \$100 bill when he had his paycheck cashed. Unaware, he gave me the cash to deposit to our shared account at a different bank. When I deposited the cash into the onsite ATM, one of the bills was rejected a few times, so I brought it to a teller who immediately inspected it and they informed me that it was counterfeit. And that quickly, we were out \$100! My husband informed his co-workers who use that bank for check cashing, but unfortunately soon after, someone else became a victim.

I wanted to share our story with as many people as possible so you won't be a victim to this terrible scam. If you receive cash from a financial institution, do not leave the premises until you check the bills because if you leave, they have no proof you received the counterfeit bill from them. And if you do happen to get a fake bill, it's illegal to try to pass it off to another establishment or person. This can happen to anyone when you least expect it. Protect your hard earned money! Remember to always check your cash and you will be...**Finance Smart!!!**

Chester Eastside Inc. (CEI) has been operating a long time food pantry and meal program, and they have recently expanded the hot meal program to Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays.

CEI is looking for groups to commit to coming once a month to serve the meal. Their most pressing need is for Fridays, but they need people for Tuesdays and Thursdays as well. It would mean arriving about 9:45 am, setting up, serving from 11 am - 12:30 pm, then cleaning up. You would be at CEI from approximately 9:45 am to 12:45 pm. We are not responsible for bringing anything, as the meal is catered. There is some salad and dessert prep at CEI before the meal is served. We would need at least 4 people who could commit to serving once a month, and we would commit to the same day each month, (such as the first Friday, the second Tuesday, etc.) depending on what day works best for everyone who is interested.

## Taizé Prayer at St Raphaela Retreat Center



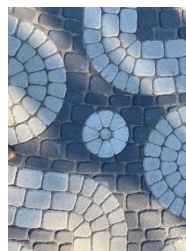

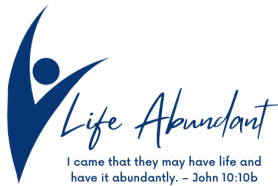

## Capital Campaign Update



Thank you for your continued generosity and support of our Capital Campaign and the way that your gifts are helping us transform our property

for the future of our ministry! Some updates on the progress of projects are below:

**Fire Pit:** This Spring, Aidan Reilley, from Troop 430 at Reformation, will be installing a permanent fire pit in the east lawn – in the space between the gazebo and the fence bordering the playground – as his Eagle Scout project. A fire pit has been a smaller project as part of our full master landscape plan, so we are excited to get one step closer and support Aidan in his pursuits!

**Pavilion:** A deposit has been placed with Pencroft (the same company that we worked with for the Gazebo). We are waiting on the receipt of the engineering prints and seeking quotes for the additional work that needs to be done for that project. We do not yet have a timeline to share on the completion of this project.

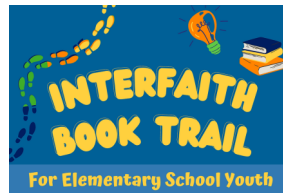

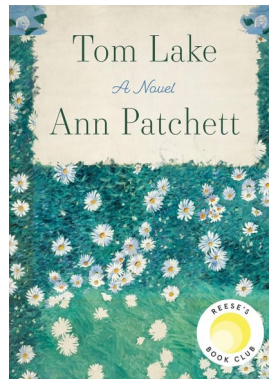

**In this beautiful and moving novel about family, love, and growing up, Ann Patchett once again proves herself one of America's finest writers.**

In the spring of 2020, Lara's three daughters return to the family's orchard in Northern Michigan. While picking cherries, they beg their mother to tell them the story of Peter Duke, a famous actor with whom she shared both a stage and a romance years before at a theater company called *Tom Lake*. As Lara recalls the past, her daughters examine their own lives and relationship with their mother, and are forced to reconsider the world and everything they thought they knew.

*Tom Lake* is a meditation on youthful love, married love, and the lives parents have led before their children were born. Both hopeful and elegiac, it explores what it means to be happy even when the world is falling apart. As in all of her novels, Ann Patchett combines compelling narrative artistry with piercing insights into family dynamics. The result is a rich and luminous story, told with profound intelligence and emotional subtlety, that demonstrates once again why she is one of the most revered and acclaimed literary talents working today.

Dear Reformation,

It is a joy to share with you all that I have successfully defended my doctoral thesis and am preparing to graduate with my Doctor of Ministry on May 18! (Joining me in the United Lutheran Seminary Class of 2024 is my husband, Pastor Daniel Smith, earning his Master of Sacred Theology and our Deacon Intern, Vicar Paula Estornell, earning her Master of Arts in Ministerial Leadership.)

I am grateful for all of your support and encouragement over the past several years as I completed my coursework and my thesis. Your love and cheers have made this accomplishment all the more wonderful!

On April 7 and 14, I will be leading a two-part presentation during the education hour at 9:45 am to share my research. (You are welcome to join for just one if you can't make both!) I will be sharing highlights from my thesis, *Beyond the Stained Glass Ceiling: Freeing Women Clergy from the Patriarchy to Thrive in Ministry*. My project explores the challenges that women clergy continue to disproportionately encounter despite more than a half-decade of the right for women to be ordained in our own tradition. It includes first-person accounts from women clergy around the country from the largest Protestant traditions in the U.S.
