

At the heart of the Good Friday liturgy is the passion according to John, which proclaims Jesus as a triumphant king who reigns from the cross. The ancient title for this day – the triumph of the cross – reminds us that the church gathers not to mourn this day but to celebrate Christ's life-giving passion and to find strength and hope in the tree of life. In the ancient bidding prayer we offer petitions for all the world for whom Christ died. Today's liturgy culminates in the Easter Vigil tomorrow evening.




#### PRAYER OF THE DAY

**G** Amen.





(after each prayer)


- $\mathbf{P}$  ... We ask this through Christ our Lord.
- **G** Amen.
- ▶ Finally, let us pray for all those things for which our Lord would have us ask.
- Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.
- P Behold, the life-giving cross on which was hung the salvation of the whole world.
- **G** Oh, come, let us worship him.

# Silence for meditation on the mystery of the crucified Savior, the mystery of redemption

## ADORATION OF THE CRUCIFIED CHRIST

- May God be merciful and bless us; may the light of God's face shine upon us. Let your way be known upon earth, your saving health among all nations.

- **C** Let the peoples praise you, O God; let all the peoples praise you. May God give us blessing, and may all the ends of the earth stand in awe.
- We glory in your cross, O Lord, and we praise your holy resurrection, for by your cross joy has come into the world.

All stand and sing, proclaiming the triumph of the cross.



The assembly is seated.

- **P** We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you.
- **G** By your holy cross you have redeemed the world.

The ministers leave in silence.

Please remain as long as you wish to be in prayer with the Lord this night.

When you are ready to leave, do so in silence, respecting those who remain in prayer.

The omission of benedictions at the end of the liturgies of both Maundy Thursday and Good Friday indicate their continuity with each other and with the Vigil of Easter, one celebration of the paschal mystery of our redemption.
