I wanted to get the word out about a new phishing scam in



Pennsylvania. If you are a PA Turnpike E-ZPass customer, listen up! You may or may not have heard that some PA Turnpike E-ZPass customers are receiving text messages that they owe an outstanding toll balance on their account and are warned if they do not pay the balance owed, they will need to pay a \$50 late fee. Here is an example of the text:

PA Turnpike toll services: We've noticed an outstanding toll amount of \$12.51 on your record. To avoid a late fee of \$50.00, visit https://myturnpiketollservices.com to settle your balance.

This is a scam! Do not click on the link and fall victim! If you would like more info, here is the link to the scam alert:

Chester Eastside Inc. (CEI) has been operating a long-time food pantry and meal program, and they have recently expanded the hot meal program to Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays.

CEI is looking for groups to commit to coming once a month to serve the meal. Their most pressing need is for Fridays, but they need people for Tuesdays and Thursdays as well. It would mean arriving about 9:45 am, setting up, serving from 11 am - 12:30 pm, then cleaning up. You would be at CEI from approximately 9:45 am to 12:45 pm. We are not responsible for bringing anything, as the meal is catered. There is some salad and dessert prep at CEI before the meal is served.

We would need at least 4 people who could commit to serving once a month, and we would commit to the same day each month (such as the first Friday, the second Tuesday, etc.), depending on what day works best for everyone who is interested. If there are 4 people who are interested and available at the same time, we could be a team to cover one meal each month. 
