Reformation Named One of the ELCA's Most Generous Congregations!

In 2023, Reformation was one of 4,200 members in the ELCA Leadership Circle that shared nearly \$30 million with ELCA ministries. Because of Reformation's generosity, in 2023:

- **345** seminary students received ELCA Fund for Leaders scholarships.
- 292 new-start congregations or ministries engaged with their communities.
- 101 missionary families worked alongside our companions in 41 countries.
- 66 countries around the world, including the United States, implemented programs supported by ELCA World Hunger.
- 28 young adults served in countries around the world through Young Adults in Global Mission.
- 755 young adults participated in small-group ministries through Abide or Gather, either virtually or in person.
- Lutheran Disaster Response coordinated responses in 51 countries and 34 US states and territories.

Vicar Paula Appointed Program Director of the Love Revolution



The Southeastern Pennsylvania Synod is pleased to announce the appointment of

Paula Estornell as Program Director of the Love Revolution. This position is funded through a grant from The Lilly Endowment, Inc., which awarded the synod \$1.070.392 to establish the program "Love Revolution: Love God and Love Neighbor."

This new initiative will help congregations evolve from an institutional church built on programs and resources into a missional church built on relationships and service.

Over five years the Love Revolution will work with a cohort of congregations and their lay leaders to deepen faith and discipleship and serve the needs of their neighborhood. As we imagine the church we are becoming postpandemic, we will help congregations focus on this core teaching of Jesus: love God and love neighbor.

"We are blessed that Lilly Endowment Inc., has entrusted us through this grant to support Love Revolution," said Bishop Patricia A. Davenport. "We trust and pray that this might be a model that causes a ripple effect of God's love across the nation."

"I hope that the Love Revolution will be a game changer for congregations as we help them focus on the critical work of congregational vitality," said The Rev. Bryan Penman, Co-Director of Evangelical Mission and Bishop-elect of the Southeastern Pennsylvania Synod.



The ELCA is developing a social statement on civic life and faith, the relationship of

church and state, and related matters, as called for by the 2019 ELCA Churchwide Assembly.

Social statements are the ELCA's primary documents to address significant social issues. They are intended to aid reflection, shape conscience and set forth the ELCA's teaching and policy on the major social issues and questions of contemporary life. Social statements are developed by task forces, using an established process of study and widespread participation across the church to guide theological and moral deliberation.

At this time the task force encourages you to study and give feedback on a draft version of the social statement. You can download the draft of the social statement and complete a feedback survey at elca.org/civicsandfaith.

The feedback period will be open until **September 30**, 2024.

PAR stands for People Advancing Reintegration. This nonprofit was started to help those who were recently incarcerated reenter the workforce. By working at PAR they are able to gain useful skills and receive intentional mentorship as they navigate this next chapter, while also helping to make a positive difference for the environment! When we support PAR through electronics recycling, they are able to teach these tech skills to the people in their program and use funds from the recycling to support their programs. As you know, the situation in Gaza continues to unfold with unimaginable violence. While our trip would not be in the same area of Israel and Palestine, many borders are still closed and other travel could be inhibited due to the war. As such, we have reached out to our trip coordinator with Good Shepherd Travel and have moved our trip to January 5-15, 2026.

In the meantime, we invite you to do some of the following as we pray for peace and support our siblings in the Holy Land:

- Follow the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land and the Evangelical Lutheran Church of the Reformation, Beit Jala on social media. (Reformation, Media supports Reformation, Beit Jala through our Endowment Outreach fund annually and we hope that Pastor Ashraf Tannous might be able to visit us in 2025.)
- Sign up for updates through <u>Sumud</u> a ministry of the ELCA that will provide you with advocacy alerts and information on the work of justice in Palestine and Israel.



About The Women from Goodreads:

An intimate portrait of coming of age in a dangerous time and an epic tale of a nation divided.

Women can be heroes. When twenty-year-old nursing student Frances "Frankie" McGrath hears these words, it is a revelation. Raised in the sun-drenched, idyllic world of Southern California and sheltered by her conservative parents, she has always prided herself on doing the right thing. But in 1965, the world is changing, and she suddenly dares to imagine a different future for herself. When her brother ships out to serve in Vietnam, she joins the Army Nurse Corps and follows his path.

As green and inexperienced as the men sent to Vietnam to fight, Frankie is over- whelmed by the chaos and destruction of war. Each day is a gamble of life and death, hope and betrayal; friendships run deep and can be shattered in an instant. In war, she meets—and becomes one of-the lucky, the brave, the broken, and the lost.

But war is just the beginning for Frankie and her veteran friends. The real battle lies in coming home to a changed and divided America, to angry protesters, and to a country that wants to forget Vietnam.

The Women is the story of one woman gone to war, but it shines a light on all women who put themselves in harm's way and whose sacrifice and commitment to their country has too often been forgotten. A novel about deep friendships and bold patriotism, *The Women* is a richly drawn story with a memorable heroine whose idealism and courage under fire will come to define an era.


