# Reformation Lutheran Church, Media, PA Funeral Service Information and Guidelines

Dear Friends,

In life and in death we belong to God. God cares for us before we are brought into this world, sustains us through all our earthly days, and holds us with everlasting arms when this life is over. For a Christian, we find hope in Christ's resurrection that death does not get the last word.

At Reformation, funerals and memorial services are services that witness to the resurrection hope we have in Jesus Christ, an opportunity to give thanks to God for life, and to look ahead to that time when God's reign will be fully realized and we will be with God.

If you are using this information for pre-planning purposes, we hope you will share your decisions with your family. Additionally, provide a copy to the church office for our records - they will be kept in a confidential place.

If you are using this information for planning a service for a loved one who has recently died, please be in touch with one of us as soon as possible to schedule the service. Additional details are in the pages to follow, but we are always available for conversation and assistance with planning.

It is our desire at Reformation to care for and assist you and your family with this process.

**Please note:** This information has been prepared for on-site funerals held at Reformation. For funerals held at other locations, please be in conversation with the pastors about which of these items still apply.

## Scheduling a Funeral/Memorial at Reformation

The pastors welcome opportunities to work with individuals and families to plan funerals before the time of death. The pastors encourage individuals to communicate their wishes and desires with family and friends. Whenever possible, these wishes and desires should be put in writing – Reformation can provide this form– and filed with the responsible parties as well as the church office.

#### When Death Occurs

A pastor should be notified as soon as possible when a death occurs. Our pastors are available to offer prayer and comfort, as well as assist with the practical realities of dealing with grief and loss. Funeral and memorial services are always under the direction of the pastors.

## **Making Formal Arrangements**

Please contact a pastor before making formal arrangements. A pastor will work with the family and funeral home to ensure your loved one's funeral is handled with the utmost dignity and respect.

#### **Funeral Home Involvement**

We strongly encourage the use of a funeral home as their staff provide invaluable assistance for direction and onsite management of the service. It is very important that a pastor work with the funeral home directors as a team. If you have not yet contacted the church when you begin working with the funeral home, please ask the funeral director to call the church immediately. *Please do not schedule a funeral without first contacting the church and speaking with a pastor.* 

#### Visitation

On occasion, families request that a visitation be held at the church. That is customary and can happen the evening prior to the service or on the same day preceding the service.

## **Planning the Service**

Reformation encourages all to fill out the funeral planning form provided. By doing so, individuals will have the opportunity to share their wishes with the church and with their loved ones prior to the time of their death.

A pastor of Reformation will officiate at each funeral/memorial service held at the church. With pastoral approval, other clergy (ELCA, other Christian traditions, interfaith religious leaders) may participate in the service. Pastoral ethics preclude the participation of former pastors of Reformation in the service. The family is responsible for paying visiting clergy fees. Family members, friends and members of the congregation are always welcome to participate in the service.

## **Order of Service**

At Reformation, the funeral liturgy follows the pattern found in *Evangelical Lutheran Worship*. Many options are available within this resource to personalize the service. However, the order for worship will follow the pattern found below:

- Gathering (including entrance, introduction, prayer, and remembrances)
- Word (including scripture readings and a brief sermon)
- Meal (optional please see details below about including communion in the funeral service)
- Sending (including blessing and dismissal)

#### Music

Musicians from the church are available to play during the service. Outside musicians can be invited, any rehearsal necessary should be organized through the church office. Music used in the service should be appropriate for the sacred setting. A list of suggested songs is provided in this document. Because of copyright, some music may not be able to be used for the service. The pastors will help make that determination.

## Scripture

A funeral at Reformation is a worship service, and worship always includes the reading of scripture. Suggested readings are provided in this document.

#### Remembrances

Often the inclusion of remembrances is a meaningful addition to the worship service. It is highly recommended that this not be an open invitation to any attendees and that the person(s) speaking be identified ahead of the service. A pastor is always happy to read a written remembrance on the family's behalf.

## **Holy Communion**

Because the funeral liturgy is part of the "foretaste of the feast to come," many choose to include the sacrament of holy communion in the service. Funeral eucharists will be celebrated by the whole community in accordance with the policies of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in

America (ELCA). All are welcome at the table of our Lord Jesus Christ where God nourishes faith, forgives sin, and calls us to be witnesses to the Gospel. We believe Christ is present in the bread and wine.

#### **Bulletins**

A pastor will work with you to create the bulletin for the service. A photo can be printed on the cover as well as any obituary information inside the bulletin.

#### **Flowers**

Flowers are an appropriate memorial tribute. Flowers may be delivered during office hours on weekdays prior to the service and someone will be at the church on the day of the service to accept flower deliveries. The funeral home or family should make arrangements to have the flowers removed after the service - we are unable to keep them at Reformation. Flowers are able to be placed in the lobby or the sanctuary. Flowers are not permitted on the altar.

#### **Live Stream**

Reformation has the capability to live stream services in the sanctuary, as well as record. If you would like this for the funeral service, please request a tech by speaking with a pastor. This service will be provided if a tech is available for the service. The tech will be paid directly by the family.

#### **Donations**

Please inform the church of any specific donation requests for people to contribute as a memorial. If Reformation is the recipient, please indicate any particular ministry areas or projects the money should be designated to if there are preferences. Undesignated funds are used at the discretion of the Council.

## **Military and Civil Ceremonies**

Military honors and other civil ceremonies can be a meaningful part of the funeral/memorial. When those presiding at these ceremonies arrive at the church for the service, the pastor will greet them, go over their part of the service and help them with anything they might need. Civil Ceremonies - such as fraternal orders - will be done prior to the service, during the visitation time.

#### Cemetery

A pastor will be available to accompany the funeral procession to the cemetery for burial and provide a graveside service. Any other honors, such as military honors, will be done before the

graveside prayers. Please inform the pastor at the time of planning the location, and date if different from the service, for the graveside portion of the service.

## Reception

The fellowship hall at Reformation is not available on weekdays during the school year. The availability of the space at other times is dependent on the church schedule. If a family wishes to use the fellowship hall for a reception following the service, the family will be responsible for all setup and clean up. Please speak with a pastor about scheduling use of the space. Additionally, the pastors are able to provide suggestions on local restaurants that have space for gatherings like these.

#### **Fees**

There is no fee to use the sanctuary for a funeral service. Hororarias to the officiating pastor, musician, and live stream tech are customary. It is best for the funeral home to provide those checks directly to the staff members leading the service. If a funeral home is not used, the family will make payments directly to the staff members.

The appropriate honorarias are as follows:

Pastor \$200 Musician \$175 Live Stream Tech \$150
