advocates and coalition partners across PA and the Church?

ELCA Hunger Advocacy Fellows participate in a year-long formative experience that supports their growth as a leader, as a person of faith, and as a professional advocate for an end to hunger and a just world where all are fed.

The 2025-26 Hunger Advocacy Fellow is a full-time term-contract employee (with benefits) of the ELCA. The 2025-26 Hunger Advocacy Fellow, placed with the Lutheran Advocacy Ministry in Pennsylvania (LAMPa), will serve as a member of the staff of this ELCA-affiliated state public policy office (sppo) as a full-time term-contract employee.

The Hunger Advocacy Fellow working in Pennsylvania will learn the concrete skills of faith-based policy advocacy by embedding within and becoming a vital member of ELCA advocacy staff. These work experiences will build their professional skills and relationships, support their faith development, and help them discern and launch the next steps in their professional calling. Focusing on analyzing and addressing the root causes of hunger and economic injustice, and promoting a holistic approach to hunger ministry, the Hunger Advocacy Fellow will build ELCA World Hunger capacity to end hunger by deepening and expanding Lutheran statewide advocacy efforts in synods, coalitions and networks. 




A cat a day keeps the doctor away....


Discover this utterly charming, vibrant celebration of the healing power of cats in the award-winning, bestselling Japanese novel that has become an international sensation.

Reformation's Impact on Fair Trade



Equal Exchange's mission is to build long-term trade partnerships that are economically just and environmentally sound, to foster mutually beneficial relationships between farmers and consumers and to demonstrate, through our success, the contribution of worker co-operatives and Fair Trade to a more equitable, democratic and sustainable world. Because Reformation only buys and serves Equal Exchange Fair Trade coffee at Reformation this is the impact we've helped make possible:

- In just coffee alone, Equal Exchange estimates that during their sale they sold roughly the annual harvest of 9 family farms. That's 678,018 cups of coffee!
- In mid-April, Equal Exchange launched the <u>Small Farmer Fund</u>, a new initiative to support their farmer partners as they face unprecedented market and climate changes. So far, our network of dedicated supporters has contributed:\$15,116.93 to the Small Farmer Fund from 347 donations.

Eco Tips for July



Kindling Faith: Theological Education with Adults - A Deep Dive into the Gospel of John

July 13 - 18 Gettysburg, PA or online



The Gospel of John stands apart from the Synoptic Gospels (Matthew, Mark, and Luke) in both style and content. It emphasizes Jesus' divine nature more explicitly, beginning with the profound theological statement, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God" (John 1:1). John focuses on Jesus' identity as the Son of God through unique "I Am" statements, lengthy discourses, and symbolic miracles, rather than parables.

The Rev. Dr. Allison deForest serves as the Kraft Assistant Professor of Biblical Studies in New Testament. Her areas of research are John's Gospel, Biblical Justice, and Science and Scripture.

Kindling Faith: Aging Grace-Fully Author Series

This series examines how to age with grace and live fully, with the physical, mental and social challenges that are often difficult to navigate and accept as we age. It is offered in person on the Gettysburg campus and via livestream, and is funded through a generous grant from the Lutheran Foundation for Long Term Living (LFLTL.org). On May 10, four Scouts from Reformation's Troop, #430, earned the rank of Eagle Scout! Our troop has over 100 Eagle Scouts!




