
CG 7: Family Interfaith Sampler







share their memories of their time in the program.


Underwear Collection

Churchwide Assembly Update



The ELCA Churchwide
Assembly was held in
Phoenix, AZ from July 28August 2, 2025. This
triennial gathering brings
together representatives from

all 65 synods to conduct the work of the whole ELCA. Some highlights of that gathering include:

- Bishop Yehiel Curry was elected to a six year term as the Presiding Bishop of the ELCA.
- Pastor Lucille "CeCee" Mills was elected to a six year term as the Secretary of the ELCA.
- Acceptance of the Social Statement "Faith and Civic Life: Seeking the Well-being of All" and edits to the Social Statement "Human Sexuality: Gift and Trust"
- Reception of the Report from the 2024
 Lutheran-Orthodox "Common Statement on the Filioque"
- Passing of Memorials on the creation of an Indian Boarding School Day of Remembrance, institution of recommendations from the Commission for a Renewed Lutheran Church, and standing for Palestinian Rights and End to Occupation of Palestine.
- Adoption of amendments to the ELCA Model Constitution.
