

Caring for Friends

This ministry serves isolated homebound persons, primarily the frail elderly, in the Greater Philadelphia area, with free daily home-cooked meals delivered weekly by volunteer visitors. The goal is to help people enhance their quality of life, maintain their independence, and remain in their own homes for as long as possible. Their wish list includes the following: **shelf stable, non-perishable foods, single serve items that can be used for snack bags (juice bags, fruit cups, applesauce cups, granola bars, oatmeal packets, etc.).**

Chester Eastside Ministry

A respected force for good in Chester, this agency provides food and clothing ministries, basic tutoring and educational enrichment programs, crisis counseling and community advocacy programs.

Target and Wal-Mart gift cards requested. Please indicate the amount of the gift card and place in an envelope marked "Chester Eastside". \$25 gift cards preferred.

Domestic Abuse Project

Domestic Abuse Project provides services for partners and their families who are in abusive relationships. Microsoft ended support for Windows 10 last month and is no longer providing security updates or patches on Windows 10 devices, making them more vulnerable to security risks. If you haven't done so yet, check your device that may be running on Windows 10, or have someone more qualified do it, to see if it is eligible for Windows 11. If it is not and you are unable to purchase a new device at this time, Microsoft offers a paid Extended Security Updates (ESU) program which provides an extra year of critical updates. Dear Reformation,





Do you have used but wearable sneakers that you

no longer want? A good idea would be to donate them! Check with your local homeless shelters or you can drop them off at any Green Drop location near you. 

Raymond Jaffe feels like he doesn't belong. Not with his mother's new family. Not as a weekend guest with his father and his father's wife. Not at school, where he's an outcast. After his best friend moves away, Raymond has only two real connections to the feral cat he's tamed and to a blind ninety-two-year-old woman in his building who's introduced herself with a curious *Have you seen Luis Velez?*

Mildred Gutermann, a German Jew who narrowly escaped the Holocaust, has been alone since her caretaker disappeared. She turns to Raymond for help, and as he tries to track Luis down, a deep and unexpected friendship blossoms between the two.

Despondent at the loss of Luis, Mildred isolates herself further from a neighborhood devolving into bigotry and fear. Determined not to let her give up, Raymond helps her see that for every terrible act the world delivers, there is a mirror image of deep kindness, and Mildred helps Raymond see that there's hope if you have someone to hold on to.

Reformation members provided parking assistance for our friends at Congregation Beth Israel as they gathered for their high holiday services on October 3.




