
Sock Collection

Sunday Adult Education Forum: *Reading The Book of Revelation Ecologically*

The Book of Revelation is perhaps one of the most misunderstood texts in the Bible. It features prominently in the lectionary readings appointed for the Easter season. While often associated in popular culture with apocalyptic end times and used to brush away Christian concerns for the Earth, Revelation is a book of hope and can be a theological resource for Creation care. This adult education forum will situate Revelation in its historical context in which it was written in the first century CE, and closely reread Revelation 12 in which Earth herself features prominently as a character.

Saturday Workshop: *Rising from "The Fall": Creation Care in Genesis 1-4*

Genesis 1-4 presents three stories-a beautifully expansive liturgy of the creation of the world in seven days, one about the relationships among God, Earth and humanity in the Garden, and another about the first murder that leads to the founding of the first city. In four short chapters the biblical story moves from God's intention for intimate inter-relationship to brokenness and alienation. This workshop will take a classically Lutheran "both/and" approach, exploring both how Creation and humanity are gifted with the grace of relationship from God and how humanity continually falls short in those relationships. In preparation for the celebration of Eco Sunday, these texts will be read with an eye toward how they might serve as theological resources for enlivening Creation care today.



The Eco Ministry invites you to use this simple outline to walk, reflect, and pray this winter.



SEARCH FOR SNOWFLAKES

Every snowflake has a unique design. They remind us of how God has created each of us with our own unique design. Use this time outside to look for the gifts of winter in creation.

READ SCRIPTURE

Many passages of the Bible discuss the beauty of God's work in creation. Read Psalm 148 before and after your walk. What stands out to you? Talk or write about your thoughts on the passage.



CAPTURE IMAGES

Capture images of your time outside. Use them as a devotional practice. Take photos, draw or write what you see. Look for where you see God at work in creation.

SHARE YOUR EXPERIENCE

Invite others on your walk. Share photos from your walk with family and friends (or in the Reformation Facebook group!). Talk about the scripture you read and what stands out to you, where you noticed the passage come to life outside. Share your highlights with each other.

Over 30 years ago, the Souper Bowl of Caring began with this prayer: "Lord, even as we enjoy the Super Bowl football game, help us to be mindful of those without a bowl of soup to eat."

The movement that started has since raised over \$170 million for local food assistance organizations across the country.

The Souper Bowl of caring is just one way in which we are able to serve our neighbors right in our own community. According to statistics 1 in 6 people in America face hunger. The people in our area served by the Media Food Bank know the realities of food insecurities. Donations to food banks help to alleviate the hunger that so many face.

You are invited to bring a food donation with you to worship on Sunday, February 13. This year we are collecting honey, canned fish, dried beans, and diapers. (Food banks have an overabundance of soup donations right now and are in need of these other staples for those they serve.) The collected items will be taken to the Media Food Bank for distribution.

Last year we collected 510 items for the food pantry. We invite you to play a part in helping to feed those in need as we hope to meet or beat that number. Together we tackle hunger!

The scholarship is awarded to an applicant(s) who demonstrates a high level of academic, religious, and community-oriented commitment and achievement. The scholarship is awarded annually in July.

Applications for the 2022-2023 academic year may be obtained by downloading from the church website; a printed copy by contacting




