Rising from "The Fall": Creation Care in Genesis 1-4

Saturday, April 23, 2022, 9:00 am – 12:30 pm

Genesis 1-4 presents three stories—a beautifully expansive liturgy of the creation of the world in seven days, one about the relationships among God, Earth and humanity in the Garden, and another about the first murder that leads to the founding of the first city. In four short chapters the biblical story moves from God's intention for intimate inter-relationship to brokenness and alienation. This workshop will take a classically Lutheran "both/and" approach, exploring both how Creation and humanity are gifted with the grace of relationship from God and how humanity continually falls short in those relationships. In preparation for the celebration of Eco Sunday, these texts will be read with an eye toward how they might serve as theological resources for enlivening Creation care today.



Dr. Crystal Hall is the Kraft Assistant Professor of Biblical Studies at United Lutheran Seminary (ULS). She has taught at ULS since 2018 and co-directs the Guatemala Immersion Semester Program. Her research and teaching address God's call into right relationship with the human Other and with Earth. She is a frequent speaker in congregational and synodical settings on women's leadership, LGBTQIA+ inclusion, and immigration. Before coming to ULS, Dr. Hall worked as a community organizer and political educator with organizations advocating for human rights, environmental justice and ending poverty. She served on staff with the Poverty Initiative (now the Kairos Center for Religions, Rights and Social Justice), United Workers and the Sierra Club. Dr. Hall is a lay leader in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). She resides in Philadelphia, and enjoys hiking and bringing friends together around a meal.



Upcoming Events

In the winter and spring of 2022, Interfaith Philadelphia is offering six Art of Interfaith Understanding tour dates with the Philadelphia Museum of Art.

All programs will be guided by Rev. John B. Hougen, PhD, a consultant with Interfaith Philadelphia and a volunteer guide at the Philadelphia Museum of Art. These programs are co-sponsored by Interfaith Philadelphia & the Philadelphia Museum of Art's Division for Community Engagement.

Due to current restrictions on group tours at the Philadelphia Museum of Art, all upcoming tours will be offered virtually. Interfaith Philadelphia offers a sliding scale fee structure for our programs in order to welcome all from our community who wish to attend.

The next tour is "Graven Images: Prohibitions against Image Making and the Art of Judaism, Christianity, and Islam". The Abrahamic

traditions (Judaism, Christianity, and Islam), all support the making of art that conveys sacred truths. At the same time, all three traditions have passages in their sacred texts that forbid making graven images. Within each of the three traditions there are competing interpretations



of the relevant texts, resulting in a variety of artistic practices among devotees of each tradition. Looking at art from the three traditions, we will come to a greater appreciation of the variety of ways art and faith intersect, while noting similarities and differences among the Abrahamic faiths. The tours are scheduled for Sunday, March 13 from 2-3:30 pm or Thursday, March 17 from 7-8:30 pm. Rev. Hougen will be joined by both a Jewish and Muslim presenter TBD.

The season of Lent, which begins on March 2, Ash Wednesday, invites us to continually be renewed in Christ. We are renewed in faith as we return daily to the relationship God created with us in baptism. Being renewed in faith is more a matter of the heart than a matter of the head.

My understanding of this idea has been deepened by the writing of biblical scholar Marcus Borg about what it means to believe. Borg writes:

Prior to the seventeenth century, the word "believe" did not mean believing in truth of statements or propositions

Grammatically, the object of believing was not statements, but a person. Moreover, the contexts in which it is used in premodern English make it clear that it meant: to hold dear; to prize; to give one's loyalty to; to give one's self to; to commit oneself. It meant . . . faithfulness, allegiance, loyalty, commitment, and trust.

Most simply, "to believe" meant "to love." Indeed, the English words "believe" and "belove" are related. What we believe is what we belove. Faith is about beloving God. . . . to believe in God is to belove God. . . . Faith is the way of the heart.

Marcus J. Borg, The Heart of Christianity: Rediscovering a Life of Faith, pp. 40, 41

The Lent coloring page on page 7 of this newsletter is in the shape of a heart with a cross superimposed on it. You can use it to mark the journey from Ash Wednesday to Easter Day by coloring one section a day. As you do so, be reminded that "faith is about beloving God" whose love for us was revealed by the cross of Christ.


