

SECOND READING


A reading from Romans.

What should be our response? Simply this: "If God is for us, who can be against us?" Since God did not spare the Only Begotten but gave Christ up for the sake of us all, we may be certain, after such a gift, that God will freely give us everything. Who will bring a charge against God's chosen ones? Since God is the One who justifies, who has the power to condemn? Only Christ Jesus, who died—or rather, was raised—and sits at the right hand of God, and who now intercedes for us! What will separate us from the love of Christ? Trouble? Calamity? Persecution? Hunger? Nakedness? Danger? Violence? As scripture says, "For your sake, we're being killed all day long; we're looked upon as sheep to be slaughtered." Yet in all this, we are more than conquerors because of God who has loved us. For I am certain that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, neither heights nor depths—nor anything else in all creation—will be able to separate us from the love of God that comes to us in Christ Jesus, our Savior.

GOSPEL

P The Holy Gospel according to Luke.

Glory to you, O Lord.

An expert on the law stood up to put Jesus to the test and said, "Teacher, what must I do to inherit everlasting life?" ²⁶ Jesus answered, "What is written in the Law? How do you read it?"²⁷ The expert on the law replied, "You must love the Most High God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength and with all your mind, and your neighbor as vourself." Jesus said, "You have answered correctly. Do this and you will live." ²⁹ But the expert on the law, seeking self-justification, pressed Jesus further, "And who is my neighbor?" ³⁰ In reply Jesus said: "A traveler was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, when they were attacked by robbers. The traveler was beaten, stripped naked, and left halfdead. ³¹ A priest happened to be going down the same road, and when he saw the traveler, he passed by on the other side. ³² So too, a Levite came to the place and saw the traveler, and passed by on the other side. ³³ But a Samaritan, who was taking the same road, also came upon the traveler and, filled with compassion went to them and bandaged their wounds, pouring on oil and wine. Then the Samaritan put the traveler on a donkey, brought him to an inn and took care of them. ³⁵ The next day the Samaritan took out two denarii and gave them to the innkeeper, saying 'Look after this traveler, and when I return, I will reimburse you for any extra expense you may have.' ³⁶ "Which of these three do you think was a neighbor to the traveler who fell into the hands of robbers?" ³⁷ The expert in the law replied, "The one who showed compassion." Jesus replied, "Go and do likewise."






The assembly is seated.

All are welcome at the table of the Lord! We believe and teach that Christ is present in the mystery of the sacrament of Holy Communion and that by communing with him we receive forgiveness of our sin.

Communion will be distributed by intinction – after you receive the bread, you may dip it in the chalice on the bread tray, which has grape juice, or the chalice held by the communion assistant, which has wine. Children who have not received instruction for communion are invited to come forward for a blessing. If you are unable to walk to communion, please let an usher know so that a pastor can bring communion to your seat. Gluten free wafers are available upon request to the pastor distributing the bread.

As the ministers give the bread and wine, they say these words to each communicant: The body of Christ, given for you. The blood of Christ, shed for you. The communicant may say: Amen The assembly sings the following during communion:


