Land acknowledgement – Reformation is located on the original and ancestral homelands of the Lenapehoking (Lenni-Lenape) people, and we give thanks for their presence here since time immemorial. GATHERING PSALM Psalm 51:1-17

- P Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love; in your great compassion blot out my offenses.
- **Q** Wash me through and through from my wickedness, and cleanse me from my sin.

GOSPEL Matthew 6:1-6, 16-21

P The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew.

Glory to you, O Lord.

[Jesus said to the disciples:] ¹"Beware of practicing your piety before others in order to be seen by them; for then you have no reward from your Father in heaven. ²"So whenever you give alms, do not sound a trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, so that they may be praised by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. ³But when you give alms, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, ⁴so that your alms may be done in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you. ⁵"And whenever you pray, do not be like the hypocrites; for they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and at the street corners, so that they may be seen by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. ⁶But whenever you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you. ¹⁶"And whenever you fast, do not look dismal, like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces so as to show others that they are fasting. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. ¹⁷But when you fast, put oil on your head and wash your face, ¹⁸so that your fasting may be seen not by others but by your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you. ¹⁹ "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust consume and where thieves break in and steal; ²⁰but store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust consumes and where thieves do not break in and steal. ²¹For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

SERMON

INVITATION TO LENT

P Friends in Christ, today with the whole church we enter the time of remembering Jesus' passover from death to life, and our life in Christ is renewed.

We begin this holy season by acknowledging our need for repentance and for God's mercy. We are created to experience joy in communion with God, to love one another, and to live in harmony with creation. But our sinful rebellion separates us from God, our neighbors, and creation, so that we do not enjoy the life our creator intended.

As disciples of Jesus, we are called to a discipline that contends against evil and resists whatever leads us away from love of God and neighbor. I invite you, therefore, to the discipline of Lent – self-examination and repentance, prayer and fasting, sacrificial giving and works of love – strengthened by the gifts of word and sacrament. Let us continue our journey through these forty days to the great Three Days of Jesus' death and resurrection.

CONFESSION OF SIN

P Let us confess our sin in the presence of God and of one another.

Silence is kept for reflection and self-examination.

- P Most Holy and merciful God.
- We confess to you and to one another, and before the whole company of heaven, that we have sinned by our fault, by our own fault, by our own most grievous fault, in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone.
- P We have not loved you with our whole heart, and mind, and strength. We have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We have not forgiven others, as we have been forgiven.
- **ఆ** Have mercy on us, O God.
- We have shut our ears to your call to serve as Christ served us. We have not been true to the mind of Christ. We have grieved the Holy Spirit.
- **@** Have mercy on us, O God.
- P Our past unfaithfulness, the pride, envy, hypocrisy, and apathy that have infected our lives, we confess to you.
- **ఆ** Have mercy on us, O God.

- Our self-indulgent appetites and ways, and our exploitation of other people, we confess to you.
- **ఆ** Have mercy on us, O God.
- Our negligence in prayer and worship, and our failure to share the faith that is in us, we confess to you.
- **ఆ** Have mercy on us, O God.
- Our neglect of human need and suffering, and our indifference to injustice and cruelty, we confess to you.
- **ఆ** Have mercy on us, O God.
- Our false judgments, our uncharitable thoughts toward our neighbors, and our prejudice and contempt toward those who differ from us, we confess to you.
- **ఆ** Have mercy on us, O God.
- Our waste and pollution of your creation, and our lack of concern for those who come after us, we confess to you.
- **ఆ** Have mercy on us, O God.
- P Restore us, O God, and let your anger depart from us.
- **G** Hear us, O God, for your mercy is great.

IMPOSITION OF ASHES

- P Let us pray. Almighty God, you have created us out of the dust of the earth. May these ashes be a sign of our mortality and penitence, reminding us that only by the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ are we given eternal life; through the same Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord.
- **G** Amen.

Those who wish to receive ashes come forward.

The minister applies ashes to the forehead of each person with the words: Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return.

After all who desire ashes have received them, the minister leads the congregation in the conclusion of the confession.

- P Accomplish in us, O God, the work of your salvation
- **G** that we may show forth your glory in the world.
- P By the cross and passion of your Son, our Savior,
- **\textstyle bring** us with all your saints to the joy of his resurrection.
- P Almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us all our sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen us in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep us in eternal life.
- Amen.

- A Let us pray. Holy God,

 whole creation. Turn our hearts toward those who hunger, that all may know

 Savior and Lord. Amen.

COMMUNION

- **P** Taste and see that the Lord is good.
- **☑** Thanks be to God!

The assembly is seated.

All are welcome at the table of the Lord! We believe and teach that Christ is present in the mystery of the sacrament of holy communion and that by communing with him we receive forgiveness of our sin.

Communion will be distributed by intinction – after you receive the bread, you may dip it in the chalice on the bread tray, which has grape juice, or the chalice held by the communion assistant, which has wine. Children who have not received instruction for communion are invited to come forward for a blessing. If you are unable to walk to communion, please let an usher know so that a pastor can bring communion to your seat. Gluten free wafers are available upon request to the pastor distributing the bread.

As the ministers give the bread and wine, they say these words to each communicant:

The body of Christ, given for you.

The blood of Christ, shed for you.

The communicant may say: Amen

After all have communed, the assembly stands.

P The body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ strengthen you and keep you in his grace.

G Amen

PRAYER

- A Let us pray. Compassionate God, you have fed us with the bread of heaven. Sustain us in our Lenten pilgrimage: may our fasting be hunger for justice, our alms, a making of peace, and our prayer, the song of grateful hearts; through Jesus Christ our Lord.
- Amen.

- P Almighty and merciful God, the Father, the
 → Son, and the Holy Spirit, bless and preserve you.
- Amen.
