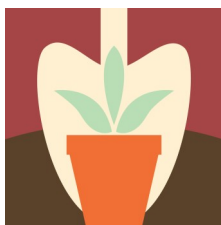

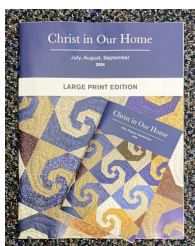

## Pastor Alina's Research Presentations

On Tuesdays, **June 18** and **25**, Pastor Alina will  
be leading a two-part presentation at 7:00 pm on  
Zoom. (This is the same two-part presentation  
done during the education hour in April.) She will  
be sharing highlights from her thesis, *Beyond  
the Stained Glass Ceiling: Freeing Women  
Clergy from the Patriarchy to Thrive in Ministry*.  
Her project explores the challenges that women  
clergy continue to disproportionately encounter  
despite more than a half-century of the right for  
women to be ordained in our own tradition. It  
includes first-person accounts from women  
clergy around the country from the largest  
Protestant traditions in the U.S.

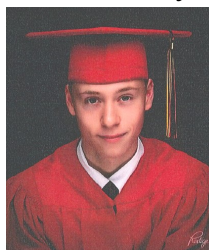

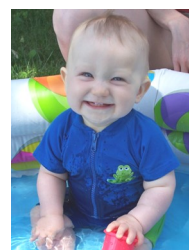

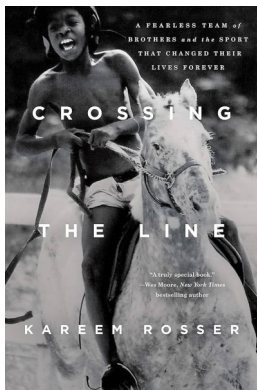

A memoir of defying the odds from Kareem Rosser, captain of the first all-black squad to win the National Interscholastic Polo championship.

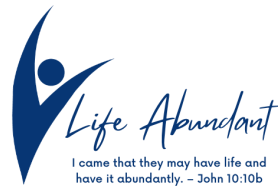
Born and raised in West Philadelphia, Kareem thought he and his siblings would always be stuck in “The Bottom”, a community and neighborhood devastated by poverty and violence. Riding their bicycles through Philly’s Fairmount Park, Kareem’s brothers discover a barn full of horses. Noticing the brothers’ fascination with her misfit animals, Lezlie Hiner, founder of The Work to Ride stables, offers them their escape: an after school job in exchange for riding lessons.

What starts as an accidental discovery turns into a love for horseback riding that leads the Rossers to discovering their passion for polo. Pursuing the sport with determination and discipline, Kareem earns his place among the typically exclusive players in college, becoming part of the first all-Black national interscholastic polo championship team—all while struggling to keep his family together.

## Finance Smart

Summer is here and the ideal time to talk about **food waste**, how we handle our food, and how our actions impact not only our household budget, but also world hunger and the environment. Let's start by asking ourselves, "How much food is wasted in my household on a weekly basis?"

According to Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations, the financial costs of food wastage are substantial and amount to about 1 trillion dollars each year. That number is staggering! All that food waste makes the vulnerable population even hungrier. When we throw away food, we are discarding precious and costly resources that could have fed hungry people. Food waste also has a huge effect on global warming. Rotting food in landfills produces 3 billion tons of greenhouse gases like methane, which directly contributes to climate change. We are locked in a bad cycle involving food waste, climate change and hunger.

Another side to these issues that we should think about is our monetary donations to local or world food assistance programs. For example, you generously give \$20 per week to World Hunger; however, you may be throwing out \$30 worth of food per week. How is that helping our cause? Not to worry! There are simple ways we can help.

Avoid buying excessive food by writing a list, watch what you buy in bulk, buy fruits and veggies that have been picked over, check your fridge temp, store perishable food in air-tight containers, store food in freezer, and give away food you will not use to family, friends or donate to local food banks. Caring for Friends is a perfect organization to save your leftovers for and help feed those in need. If you are interested in the Caring for Friends meal program, instructions, trays and soup containers are available in the church lobby.

We can do better than this! Small changes **can** make a difference so let's all make a conscious effort to start being aware of how much food we are wasting and you will be... **Finance Smart!!!**
