


A memoir of defying the odds from Kareem Rosser, captain of the first all-black squad to win the National Interscholastic Polo championship.

Noticing the brothers' fascination with her misfit animals, Lezlie Hiner, founder of The Work to Ride stables, offers them their escape: an after school job in exchange for riding lessons.

What starts as an accidental discovery turns into a love for horseback riding that leads the Rossers to discovering their passion for polo. Pursuing the sport with determination and discipline, Kareem earns his place among the typically exclusive players in college, becoming part of the first all-Black national interscholastic polo championship team-all while struggling to keep his family together.

July Eco Tip

Here are some yearround tips to help use less gas while you're out driving:



- Keep at least half a tank of fuel. You never know if you will hit bad traffic or bad weather.
- Check online for the best gas prices.
- Cut down on or plan your errands.
- Obey speed limits.
- Drive evenly avoid hard acceleration and braking.
- Aerodynamics remove roof racks and bike racks when not in use.
- Buy gas from top tier gas companies.
- Skip premium gas; use only the grade of gas indicated on the fuel filler door.
- Check tire pressure.
- Only use the A/C when necessary if mild weather, skip it!

Finance Smart

Lately it seems like email and text scams are increasing. And now with AI *(Artificial*



Intelligence) added to their arsenal, scammers are making it very difficult for us to distinguish if something is real or fake. I would like to remind you to be cautious when you get emails or texts from someone who acts as if they know you.

For example, you get an email from Pastor Eileen saying she needs a favor from you that involves buying her gift cards for a particular cause. Reformation's staff will never make a request such as this. As soon as you get the message, stop and think first. <u>Do not respond to the</u> <u>message!</u> Ask yourself, "Does this message sound like Pastor Eileen?" If you're unsure if it's legit or not, in this instance you would call the Reformation office to validate the request. It's also best to delete the email or text so it doesn't get passed along to someone else who could fall victim.

Another popular scam involves a security warning that pops up on your computer instructing you not to shut down or restart your computer. This is a fake alert pretending to be from Microsoft or Apple to trick you into thinking your computer crashed or you have a virus. It's actually a scare tactic to get you to call the support numbers they provide. <u>Do not call or respond – close the</u> <u>browser if possible!</u> When in doubt, contact a reputable source for advice such as Microsoft or Apple support.

There are many different scams. I suggest you do some research, especially on the new Al generated ones. And when in doubt, always double check your email or text sources and you will be...*Finance Smart!!!*

Kindling Faith Summer Events

Theological Learning with Adults featuring Dr. Allison deForest, Professor of New Testament: July 14 - 19.

Many of us are very used to encountering texts from Paul's 1st and 2nd Letters to the church in Corinth in the bits offered in the Lectionary on Sunday mornings. Some of these bits are favorites - some of Paul's greatest hits - others seem deeply troubling and contradictory. During this week, we will examine the biblical books 1 & 2 Corinthians as a whole, taking into account the fact that they are part of a larger set of communications between Paul and the church that he founded in Corinth. The hope is that this holistic approach will deepen our understanding of what each individual passage says and means.

ELCA Social Statement: What Does it Mean to be Lutheran in a Crucial Election Year?

Six sessions from June - October 2024 (via Zoom from 7 - 8:30 pm). As our faith informs our day-to-day lives, Lutherans recognize that "faith is active in love [and] love calls for justice in relationships and structures of society" (ELCA, Social Statement on Church in Society, 1991). We also know the church is called to be a community that prays, deliberates, and acts together when it comes to complex social issues. In this election year, how might our Lutheran faith shape our thinking, acting, and voting on major issues? Join us to learn and ponder timely social teachings of the ELCA and to learn tips for leading discussions in your own community. Up next:

- August 27: Corporate Social Responsibility -Rev. Kaari Reierson, Director of Corporate Social Responsibility for the ELCA.
- September 10: Abortion Dr. Caryn Riswold, Professor of Religion/McCoy Family Distinguished Chair in Lutheran Heritage and Mission at Wartburg College.
